SCHEME OF ARRANGEMENT.

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NOTE.—Where it is possible each of the tables is given for England (except Monmouthshire) separately from Wales, and for Wales (with Monmouthshire) separately from England, but in some cases England and Wales are combined, and in one case figures relating to Scotland are further included, as shewn in the Table of Contents following. For convenience of reference the tables relating to both England and Wales are placed together at the beginning of the volume, followed by those relating to England, the tables relating to Wales being placed together at the end of the volume.

The tables are preceded by a series of Explanatory Notes. At the end of the volume will be found two Indexes, of which the first supplies references to the pages where the various technical terms are defined, and the second furnishes an alphabetical List of the areas of the Local Authorities, with references to the pages on which the various statistics relating to the Authorities or to their areas, are given.

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PREFACE.

There is comparatively little change to record in the current issue of the Board's annual volume of Financial Statistics. The tables (Nos. 160-168) relating to the receipts and expenditure of Local Authorities in respect of Education other than elementary, or "Higher Education," are continued on almost exactly the same lines as the corresponding tables in the previous volume, which appeared for the first time in that volume in substitution for the tables formerly published in the annual Return relating to the Application of Funds to Higher Education by Local Authorities in England and Wales.

The only change of any importance in the present volume consists in the inclusion of tables giving particulars as to the salaries of Supplementary Teachers, Student-Teachers, and Pupil-Teachers on the staff of Ordinary Public Elementary Schools (Tables 172-174). In previous volumes no particulars have been given in respect of the salaries of any teachers in Public Elementary Schools other than Certificated and "Uncertificated" Teachers. It appeared to the Board, however, that it would be of interest to ascertain and publish corresponding particulars in respect of the other classes of teachers named above, who at present constitute, when taken together, no inconsiderable proportion of the total number of teachers employed in Elementary Schools.

In order to provide for the collection of the new material, the statistics of the salaries of "Uncertificated" Teachers, other than those for the comparatively small number of teachers of this category who are recognised as head teachers of small schools, have not been tabulated for the statistical year 1908-9. The Board fully recognise the relative importance of the large class of "Uncertificated" Assistant Teachers, especially when account is taken of the new provisions contained in the Code of 1909 with regard to the staffing of Public Elementary Schools. Tables giving particulars of the salaries of "Uncertificated" Assistant Teachers will accordingly be resumed at as early a date as possible, arrangements having been made for tabulating the necessary material for the statistical year 1910-11.

Certain of the tables giving particulars as to the ages of teachers in receipt of Superannuation Allowances and Annuities and of Disablement Allowances (Tables 144 and 145) have been extended so as to show in certain cases particulars for individual years of age, where they had previously been given only for groups of years, and, amongst others, sundry minor alterations have been made in the tables dealing with the Grants for

Secondary Schools, for Pupils in Preparatory Classes, for Pupil-Teachers, and for Bursars (Tables 179-185).

The year or years to which each table relates is explained either in the title of the table or in the table itself. The Explanatory Notes which immediately follow this Preface should be carefully studied before any attempt is made to draw conclusions from the figures given in the tables. In general it is important to remember the following considerations in using this volume. There is of course a rough correspondence between the growth of the work done in the various types of institution for Higher Education in each educational year, as revealed in Part I. of the statistics, and the growth of expenditure during the financial year ending next after the close of the educational year in question. While this correspondence however is pretty close as regards the amount of the Board's grants for Secondary Schools and Technological Education, since these are paid for the most part between 31st July and 31st March, it must necessarily be less exact as regards the expenditure of Local Authorities or of governing bodies of institutions; for increased salaries accrue throughout the educational year, but any one educational year is divided between two successive financial years.

An index to definitions of technical terms will be found on pages 285 and 286. Definitions of many of the terms used have already been given in Part I, and for reference to these definitions the corresponding index on pages 471-474 of Part I should be consulted.

EXPLANATORY NOTES.

PART II

FINANCIAL STATISTICS

This part of the statistics published by the Board of Education gives certain particulars of educational expenditure, and of the various sources from which this expenditure is met, with correlative details, and it also includes tables relating to Annuities, Allowances, and Pensions for Certificated Teachers, and to the Salaries of Teachers in Public Elementary Schools

The tables include statistics of the receipts and expenditure of Local Authorities, both in respect of Elementary Education and in respect of Higher Education (Tables 152-168). They do not, however, contain any statistics of the separate expenditure of managers of Public Elementary Schools not provided by Local Education Authorities, and the accounts of Secondary Schools and Pupil-Teacher Centres, and of Technical Institutions, Schools of Art, and other Schools and Classes for Further Education, receiving grants from the Board of Education, but not maintained by Local Education Authorities, have not at present been tabulated

In the references to the tables which are placed at the head of the successive sections of these explanatory notes, the symbol "E + w" placed in brackets after the numbers of the tables denotes that the tables relate to England and Wales combined. The single letter "E" indicates that the tables relate to England, the letter "w" that they relate to Wales. The figures for Monmouthshire are throughout included with those for Wales, and not with the figures for England

The financial statistics are divided under six heads —

1. Expenditure of the Board of Education out of the Parliamentary Vote
2. Annuities, Allowances, and Pensions for Certificated Teachers
3. Financial Statistics of Local Authorities in respect of Education
4. Salaries of Teachers in Public Elementary Schools
5. Grants for Secondary Schools, Pupils in Preparatory Classes, Pupil-Teachers, and Bursars
6. Accounts of Training Colleges and Hostels for Elementary School Teachers

The tables consist to a large extent of abstracts and summaries of accounts. The periods to which these accounts

relate are not the same throughout. The financial year of the Board of Education, and of Local Authorities, ends on 31st March; the summarised accounts of the Board of Education are given for the year ending 31st March, 1910, and for the two preceding years, but in the case of Local Authorities the latest accounts are for the year ending 31st March, 1909. The financial year of Training Colleges and Hostels at present ends on 31st July, though in some cases the accounts are made out for a year ending on 30th June, 31st August, or 30th September.

The tables relating to Grants for Secondary Schools, Pupils in Preparatory Classes, Pupil-Teachers, and Bursars, relate to years ending on 31st July, but they show, not the grants actually paid in the year to which the figures relate, but those paid in respect of instruction given in the year, together with certain particulars as to the numbers on account of whom the grants were paid. The greater part of the grants was paid after the end of the year in respect of which it was paid.

As regards all the tables dealing with accounts, it should be observed that the statements from which the tables are abstracted are for the most part statements of receipts and payments, not of income and expenditure, *i.e.*, they give the actual sums received and paid during a particular period, not the sums received and paid in respect of that period. This may, of course, vitiate any conclusions derived from a too close comparison of the figures for successive years. The total amount paid by the Board of Education, for instance, to meet expenditure in respect of Elementary Education, is made up of a number of payments or grants in respect of individual schools, and the amount paid in any particular financial year (ending 31st March) must necessarily be influenced by any delay of Local Authorities, or School Managers, in sending in claims, or by any further delay caused by questions arising in the consideration of the claims. The variation in these payments, again, will affect the total grants received by Local Authorities during the financial year, and will therefore tend to affect the amounts which have to be met out of rates in successive years.

It must of course be remembered that a certain portion of the payments are not ultimate payments in respect of education, but are transfers, which appear as receipts in other accounts. Thus the grants paid by the Board of Education appear as receipts in the accounts of Local Authorities, Schools, Training Colleges, &c. The gross totals of expenditure, as shown in the various tables, cannot therefore be added together in order to obtain a total expenditure in respect of education.

In the tables appearing in this volume, statistics of amounts of money have, as a rule, been given in complete pounds only. The shillings and pence have, however, been retained throughout all the calculations; they have simply been

omitted from the published figures, whether items or totals, which accordingly show in each case the number of complete pounds in the actual amount. This explains the comparatively slight differences which often occur in the tables between the sum of the items and the total given in the column; these differences being due to the total of the odd shillings and pence omitted from the various items. Since the average value of the shillings and pence omitted from each item is about ten shillings, the excess of any total given in the tables above the sum of the corresponding items should, on the average, amount to half as many pounds as the number of the items. Similarly, the total amount corresponding to any money items, for which a separate total is not actually given in the tables, will as a rule be obtained with greater accuracy than is afforded by the total of the items, if to this total is added half as many pounds as the number of the items.

Figures relating to the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands have been excluded from the statistics given in this volume, with the exception of the tables relating to Annuities, Allowances, and Pensions for Certificated Teachers (Tables 141-148)

1—Expenditure of the Board of Education out of the Parliamentary Vote—Tables 139 (E + w) and 140 (E + w)

These tables give particulars of the expenditure of the Board of Education, corresponding to some of the principal divisions, and sub-divisions, under which the Educational Statistics are classified in Part I

The amounts shown under *Heads 1-14* of these tables, as paid in each financial year ending 31st March, are the amounts charged to the corresponding heads, or sub-heads, under which money was voted by Parliament for the year in question. The amounts originally so charged in the course of each financial year are subject to certain adjustments, *e g*, in respect of over-payments made in the course of the year but not recovered till after the end of the year, or of payments made by agents of the Board during the year but not brought to account till after the end of the year, and these adjustments are not as a rule completed, in so far as regards the latest year for which figures are given, at the time when the tables are sent to the press. The figures given in any particular volume for the latest financial year may therefore be subject to certain corrections. The corrected figures, which agree with those in the published Appropriation Accounts, are given in the volume next following. The amounts entered under *Heads 11 (c), 11 (g), 13 (c), and 14 (b)* of Table 140 do not necessarily represent the amounts actually expended under these heads during the years to which the statistics relate, but they represent the grants in aid which

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were charged to the Parliamentary Vote for those years Balances in hand at the end of the year in respect of these items are carried forward towards the expenditure of the next year.

Against the total expenditure for each financial year, as shown under *Head 15* of Table 139, is to be set the total, as shown under *Head 16*, of certain sums of a miscellaneous character received by the Board, and described as "Appropriations in Aid."

2.—*Annuities, Allowances, and Pensions for Certificated Teachers—Tables 141–148 (E + W).*

(a) *Superannuation Act, 1898—Tables 141–147 (E + W).*

Reference has already been made in Part I. (*see* Explanatory Notes, pages lxxix and lxxx) to the provisions of the Elementary School Teachers (Superannuation) Act, 1898, according to which the certificate of a Certificated Teacher to whom the Act applies (*i.e.*, a teacher certificated before 1st April, 1899, who accepted the Act, or a teacher certificated after that date) expires when the teacher attains the age of 65 years, unless, on account of special fitness, the Board allow the teacher's service to continue for a further limited time. The particulars in Tables 141–147 relate to the Deferred Annuity Fund constituted under the Act, and to Superannuation Allowances and Disablement Allowances granted under it. The Act provides for the making of Rules by the Treasury and the Board of Education for carrying it into effect, and for the construction of Tables by the Treasury in reference to the Annuities payable to teachers. The Rules so made, together with the Act itself, the Tables, and an Explanatory Memorandum, are published in a separate pamphlet.

Deferred Annuity Fund—The Act provides that every Certificated Teacher to whom it applies shall make a contribution annually in respect of his "Recorded Service." These contributions are received by the Board of Education, and are paid by them to the National Debt Commissioners, by whom they are invested, the investments constituting the Deferred Annuity Fund. On attaining the age of 65, or on any later date at which his certificate expires, the teacher becomes entitled to payment out of the Deferred Annuity Fund of an Annuity, the amount of which depends, in accordance with the Tables constructed by the Treasury, on the separate contributions made by him, and on his age at the dates of the respective contributions. The annual contribution was fixed by the Act at £3 for a man, and £2 for a woman; with provision for increasing the contributions in case the average salary of Certificated Men Teachers, or of Certificated Women Teachers

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respectively, should increase beyond certain specified limits. The rate of annual contribution for men was increased to £3 5s from 1st April, 1905, with a further increase to £3 10s from 1st April, 1910; and the rate for women was increased to £2 4s from 1st April, 1901, with a further increase to £2 8s. from 1st April, 1907. Teachers whose recognition has been extended beyond the age of 65 make no contribution to the Deferred Annuity Fund after attaining that age.

In the case of teachers serving in Public Elementary Schools, and in Reformatory or Industrial Schools, the contributions are deducted from the grants paid to the School. In other cases they are paid direct to the Board.

Superannuation Allowances—If the teacher has contributed to the Deferred Annuity Fund in accordance with the Act, and his years of recorded service are not less than half the number of years which have elapsed since he became certificated, the Treasury may, on the expiry of his certificate, grant him an annual Superannuation Allowance at the rate of 10s. for each complete year of recorded service. In the case of teachers who were certificated before 1st April, 1899, this rate of 10s. is increased by 3d in the case of a man, and 2d in the case of a woman, for each complete year of recorded service served before that date. Teachers whose recognition has been extended beyond the age of 65 receive no addition to their Superannuation Allowance in respect of their extended service.

Disablement Allowances.—If a teacher has become permanently incapacitated owing to infirmity of mind or body, and has served a number of years of recorded service, not less than ten, and not less than half the years which have elapsed since he became certificated, the Treasury may, subject to certain conditions, grant him an annual Disablement Allowance. The amount of the Disablement Allowance must not exceed (a) £20 (or £15 in the case of a woman) for ten complete years of recorded service, with the addition of £1 (or 13s. 4d. in the case of a woman) for each complete additional year of recorded service, and (b) the total annual sum which the teacher might obtain from an Annuity and Superannuation Allowance by continuing to serve until the age of 65.

The Disablement Allowance is liable to be suspended, determined, or reduced in amount, if the Treasury are at any time satisfied that the teacher has ceased to be incapable of being an efficient teacher, or has ceased to be in pecuniary need of the allowance or any part of it, or (in the case of a woman) has married. A teacher, by accepting a Disablement Allowance, becomes disqualified to receive, on attaining the age of 65, any Superannuation Allowance, or any Annuity, to which he would otherwise have become entitled, unless the Disable-

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ment Allowance has meanwhile ceased through his being again employed in recorded service. The amounts of the Annuities which would have become payable to such teachers out of the Deferred Annuity Fund are applied, as shown in Tables 141 and 142, to meet the payment of current Disablement Allowances.

In determining the amount of a Superannuation or Disablement Allowance, account has to be taken of the number of years during which a teacher has been in "Recorded Service" "Recorded service" may have been either in England, Wales, Scotland, the Isle of Man, or the Island of Jersey. As regards payments in respect of service in England, Wales, or Scotland, the practice has been that, if a teacher attains the age of 65 when in service in England or Wales, the whole of his superannuation allowance is paid out of the funds provided for teachers in England and Wales, even though part of the service may have been in Scotland. A corresponding rule has been adopted with regard to teachers who attain the age of 65 years during service in Scotland. Accordingly the particulars given in the tables in this volume relate only to teachers whose last "recorded service" was in England or Wales (except in the case of Table 147, in connection with which see note on that table on page xxiii)

In the case of teachers who have served in the Isle of Man and the Island of Jersey, the amounts shown as the amounts of allowances in force, or paid, include sums payable, or paid, in respect of service in those Islands. Payments of allowances, or portions of allowances, made in respect of such service, are subsequently refunded by the authorities of the Islands, and the amounts of these repayments are shown in footnotes to Tables 142 and 143.

The amounts entered under the head of annuities similarly include such portions of the annuities as have been due to contributions in respect of recorded service in Scotland, as well as portions due to recorded service in the Isle of Man and the Island of Jersey.

"Recorded service" is defined by the Act as "such service" "in the capacity of certificated teacher in a public elementary school, not being an evening school, as is recorded" by the Board of Education or the Scotch Education Department, "and" "may include such service as is so recorded in the capacity, "within the meaning of the Education Code, either of a teacher" "in a training college, or of organising teacher, or of teacher

* In the Education Act, 1902, Section 22 (1), it is stated that "In this Act and in the Elementary Education Acts the expression 'elementary school' shall not include any school carried on as an evening school under the regulations of the Board of Education."

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“ of a central class for pupil-teachers, or in such other capacity
 “ in or connected with public elementary schools as may be for
 “ the time being prescribed, or in the capacity of a certificated
 “ teacher in a certified reformatory or industrial school.” In 1907 the Board gave notice that, after 1st June, 1907, service in the capacity of a teacher in a training college, or of organising teacher, or of teacher of a central class for pupil-teachers, would not continue to be “recorded” for the purpose of the Act, unless the teacher was employed in such capacity during the year immediately preceding that date, and certain other conditions were satisfied.

The exact number of teachers whose service in Public Elementary Schools has been “recorded” during any particular year is not shown in the tables. That number would be larger than the number of certificated teachers shown by the earlier tables, in Part I, to have been on the staff of Ordinary Public Elementary Schools, Higher Elementary Schools, &c, on the last day of the school year, for there is always, on any particular date, a certain number of teachers who are temporarily unemployed, in addition to others who have recently abandoned the profession of teacher, either temporarily or permanently.

The annuity (if any) that is due to a teacher runs from the date of expiry of the certificate, but, if the teacher is in service when the certificate expires, the superannuation allowance (if any is granted) does not commence till the actual termination of paid service. Separate figures for the numbers of annuities and allowances respectively are, however, not given in the tables, with the exception of the details given under *Heads 1 (a)* and *3 (a)* of Table 143. Accordingly any interval that occurs, in the case of teachers who are in receipt of both an annuity and an allowance, between the dates on which the annuity and the allowance respectively commence, is ignored in the tables; the latter being treated as running, like the former, from the expiry of the certificate. Similarly a combined annuity and allowance would be regarded as ceasing when the annuity ceases, even though the allowance might have been previously determined. Annuities and allowances are considered as accruing from day to day, and are paid by equal quarterly payments on 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, on proper application being made, but subject to apportionment in cases where the annuity or allowance begins or ends during the quarter.

The quarterly applications for payment of annuity or allowance may cease without notification of the reason, such as the death of the grantee. In some of these cases the application may be renewed, after a longer or shorter interval, but it is probable that in the majority of them the cessation of application is due either to the death of the grantee, or to

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the voluntary abandonment of the annuity or allowance. It is necessary for statistical purposes to fix some period, such that, if application for renewal of payment is not received before the end of that period, the annuity or allowance shall be treated as having "lapsed through cessation of application for payment." For this purpose applications received in respect of the quarterly payments falling due in the statistical year 1st August to 31st July have been grouped together, and, in order to secure as much finality in the figures as practicable, an interval of about two years is allowed. The precise method of treatment can best be explained by reference to a particular period. If a teacher received an annuity or allowance during the year 1st August, 1907, to 31st July, 1908, but had not, up to 30th June, 1910, made application for a further payment, the annuity or allowance has been treated as "lapsed through cessation of application for payment" in the year 1909-10, this year being taken as the financial year ending 31st March, 1910, since the financial year is that to which the statistics as to annuities and allowances relate.

Notwithstanding the interval of two years allowed under the rule explained in the preceding paragraph, it occasionally happens that an application for an annuity or allowance is renewed, or notification of death is received, after the annuity or allowance has been included in the number of cases "lapsed through cessation of application for payment." In all such cases the figures are corrected throughout, so as to be in accordance with the actual facts. Similar corrections are also made in cases where an allowance which had been suspended by the Treasury is allowed to be resumed.

TABLE 144 (E + W)

The age quoted in *Column 1* of the various parts of this table is the number of complete years of age. Thus the entry "60" means "60 and under 61 years of age."

In making out the figures entered in *Columns 3* and *4*, the extra months and days have been treated in a manner precisely analogous to that adopted in the treatment of extra shillings and pence (*see* pages xvi and xvii). This explains any slight disagreement between the total number of years of recorded service, as entered, and the sum of the corresponding items.

In determining the amount of an Allowance a fraction of a year is not counted. The total number of years taken into account for the calculation of Allowances is therefore less than the total number of years shown in the last line of *Column 3* of the various parts of the table by (roughly) a number equal to half the total number of teachers.

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TABLES 145 (E + W) and 146 (E + W).

The first paragraph of the note on Table 144 applies equally to these tables. Thus the entry "30-34" means "30 and under 35 years of age."

Columns 2-9 of Tables 146 (*A*) and 146 (*B*), and *Columns 2-7* of Tables 146 (*C*) and 146 (*D*), give particulars as to the number of annuities and allowances in force at the beginning and at the end of the financial year 1909-10, for teachers who were of the age specified in *Column 1* at the date of the commencement of the annuity or allowance. These columns also supply an analysis of the differences between the number of allowances in force at the beginning and at the end of the year respectively. *Columns 10-20* of Tables 146 (*A*) and 146 (*B*), and *Columns 8-18* of Tables 146 (*C*) and 146 (*D*), give the number of annuities and allowances which commenced in each year since the passing of the Act, and were still in force on 31st March, 1910. In comparing the numbers given in these columns of Table 146 with those given in Table 145, it must be remembered that if a teacher commenced to receive an annuity at the age of 65, from some date in the year ending (say) 31st March, 1905, he would be aged either 70 or 71 on 31st March, 1910, according as the birthday on which he attained the age of 65 fell in the year ending 31st March, 1905, or in that ending 31st March, 1904, and similarly in other cases. Hence the numbers, or sets of the numbers, given in *Columns 2-5* of Table 145 do not as a rule correspond exactly with any numbers, or sets of numbers, in Table 146; with the exception of the totals, which must agree.

TABLE 147 (E + W).

The accounts of the Deferred Annuity Fund are kept by the National Debt Commissioners, and are published annually in the "Appropriation Accounts," after the Report on the Board of Education Vote.

As from 1st April, 1907, the accounts of the Deferred Annuity Fund for England and Wales have been amalgamated with the accounts of the corresponding Fund for Scotland. Separate particulars for England and Wales cannot therefore be given, with the exception of those under *Heads 1 (a) and (d)*, which relate to the amounts of contributions received from teachers and the amounts paid out of the Fund.

(b) *Pensions under Codes antecedent to 1906—**Table 148 (E + W)*

This table gives particulars of the number of pensions granted during the year under provisions contained in the Codes of 1905 and earlier years, and of the number and amount

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of pensions in force at the end of the year. These pensions are limited to Certificated Teachers who were in employment as teachers, or who were recognised students in a Training College, on 9th May, 1862; but they are not open to teachers to whom the Superannuation Act of 1898 applies, i.e., to teachers who became certificated after 1st April, 1899, or to teachers who, having been certificated before that date, accepted the Act and were not proved to be unable to qualify for an allowance under it. The latest date for making application for one of these pensions was 31st March, 1906.

3.—*Financial Statistics of Local Authorities in respect of Education—Tables 149-168 (E) and 149-168 (W)*

(a) *Aid Grant to Local Education Authorities for Elementary Education—Tables 149 (E), 150 (E), 149 (W), and 150 (W)*

The grant to Local Education Authorities for Elementary Education which is known as the "Aid Grant" is paid under the provisions of Section 10 of the Education Act, 1902. The rate of the Grant for any Authority is made up as follows —

- (a) A sum equal to 4s. per scholar, and
- (b) An additional sum of $1\frac{1}{2}d$ per scholar for every complete $2d$ per scholar by which the amount which would be produced by a $1d$ rate on the area of the Authority falls short of 10s. per scholar.

The Grant is calculated on the total number of scholars in average attendance in Public Elementary Schools maintained by the Authority.

The Act provides for a reduction of the Parliamentary Grants if the total amount payable for Elementary Education by the Authority out of sources other than Parliamentary Grants is less than the produce of a $3d$ rate.

The produce of the $1d$ rate is based on the Assessable Value in force on the first day, i.e., 1st April, of the financial year in which the grant is paid. The Assessable Value is less than the full Rateable Value, as a rule to the extent of one-half the rateable value of agricultural land. The exceptions arise in the case of certain County Boroughs, in which, under the provisions of Local Acts, certain further deductions are made from the full rateable value; e.g., the Assessable Value of agricultural land is in some cases taken at one-quarter only of its rateable value, and deductions are made from the rateable value of certain classes of property, such as railways, canals, etc. For areas other than County Boroughs the Assessable Value is taken on the County Rate Basis, and does not necessarily agree with the Assessable Value on which the rate to meet expenses in respect of Elementary Education is actually levied.

In the case of areas other than the areas under County Councils the deductions from the full produce of a $1d$. rate in

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respect of loss in collection, in order to obtain the net produce for the purpose of the calculation of the Grant, are made in accordance with an Order issued by the Local Government Board in August, 1903, under Section 23(4) of the Education Act, 1902, and are based on the actual losses incurred in rates actually levied in the area, subject to a maximum deduction of 10 per cent. In the case of County Councils other than London the same Order fixes the deduction at 5 per cent., and a similar Order issued in October, 1904, also fixes the deduction at 5 per cent for London.

Since the rate of Grant does not increase continuously, but by steps of $1\frac{1}{4}d$, the amount of Grant to any individual Authority cannot be expressed very simply. On the average, however, the amount of Grant, when added to the net produce of a $\frac{3}{4}d$ rate, makes up a total of 11s $5\frac{1}{4}d$. per scholar, calculated on the number of scholars in average attendance, and this is a convenient method of obtaining an approximation to the total of the Grants paid to all the Authorities. Thus, taking the total of the figures given separately for England and Wales in the two tables numbered 149, the following results are obtained. —

The total amount of the Grant, as shown in the tables, was £2,453,176.

The Aid Grant for the financial year 1909-10 was calculated on the average attendance for school years ending in the previous financial year, *i.e.*, in the twelve months from 1st April, 1908, to 31st March, 1909, these figures being the latest available for the purpose. On the other hand the figures as to the average attendance for 1908-9 in Public and other Elementary Schools, given in the Educational Statistics (Part I), relate to school years ending in the statistical year 1908-9, *i.e.*, in the twelve months from 1st August, 1908, to 31st July, 1909.

In Column 5 of Table 150 the net produce of a $1d$ rate per scholar is given within limits differing by multiples of $2d$, in accordance with the system on which the rate of Grant is determined. Thus the entry " $2s. 6d$ " in this column means that, for any area to which the entry relates, the net produce of a $1d$. rate, when divided by the number of scholars in average attendance, gives a quotient which is more than $2s. 4d$. but not more than $2s. 6d$.

*Explanatory Notes.**(b) Special Grant for the year ending 31st March, 1910, in aid of certain Local Education Authorities for Elementary Education—Tables 151 (E) and 151 (W)*

The Special Grant paid in 1909-10, like the corresponding grants paid in the three previous years, was an exceptional grant for the purpose of aiding certain Local Education Authorities for Elementary Education in whose areas the rate for Elementary Education was especially high. The Regulations under which the Grant of 1909-10 was paid provided that where the part of the expenditure on Elementary Education, for the year ending 31st March, 1909, which was met or to be met by rates, exceeded the produce of a rate of eighteen pence in the pound, the Board might make a Special Grant, in addition to any other grants, equal to three-fourths of the excess; subject, however, to the total of the Special Grants paid to all the Authorities not exceeding £200,000. Since the total of the Grants which would otherwise have been payable proved to be above this limit, it was necessary to make a *pro rata* reduction of the Grant to each Authority, so as to reduce the total to £200,000.

The expenditure was ascertained from the part of the audited Financial Statement, for the year ending 31st March, 1909, which related to Elementary Education; the Revenue Account only, and not the Loan Account, being taken into consideration for the purpose. The Regulations provided that the Board might adjust the accounts by omitting any items of expenditure which should in their opinion have been charged to the Higher Education account or to some other account, or by inserting any income or receipts which should in their opinion have been included in the Elementary Education account. Sums applied in or towards paying off loans raised under the Education (Provision of Working Balances) Act, 1903, were excluded from consideration, as also any excess of the expenditure on administration above the produce of a $1\frac{1}{2}d$ rate, and the Board were also empowered to exclude any payment towards which, in their opinion, no contribution should be made out of the Imperial Exchequer. Any Special Grant received under the corresponding Regulations for previous years was omitted from the receipts for the purpose of the calculation, and the accounts were adjusted so far as was possible in order that they might represent, whether in respect of grants or otherwise, the normal incomings and outgoings for a complete year. For the purpose of the Grant the net produce of a $1d$. rate was calculated in the same way as for the purpose of the Aid Grant for the year ending 31st March, 1909, except that the Assessable Value was taken as that on which a specified rate was first levied in the year ending 31st March, 1909. Payment of the Special Grant for 1909-10 was limited by the Regulations to those

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Authorities which had already participated in the corresponding Special Grants for previous years.

(c) *Accounts of Local Authorities—Tables 152-168 (E)
and 152-168 (W).*

The statistics of the Receipts and Payments of Local Authorities in respect of Elementary and Higher Education, which are given in these tables, have been abstracted from the audited Financial Statements; except that the figures relating to the Higher Education accounts of a few Local Authorities include certain accounts which, though not incorporated in the Financial Statements audited by the District Auditor, have reference to educational work controlled by the Authority. The statistics relate to financial years ending on 31st March, and the tables are described as furnishing particulars of Receipts and Payments, *i.e.*, of amounts actually received and actually paid in the year. The Financial Statements of a certain comparatively small number of Local Authorities are, however, made out on the basis of Income and Expenditure, *i.e.*, they purport to include all items received or paid in respect of the year, although some of these items may have been actually received or paid in a different year.

The Board of Education do not hold themselves responsible for the accuracy of the Financial Statements as audited by the District Auditor, and the accounts have been subjected to analysis, adjustment, and reclassification from the statistical standpoint. The apportionment of the receipts and expenditure as between Elementary Education and Higher Education has, however, with a few comparatively unimportant exceptions, been taken as it stands in the audited Financial Statement, in so far as regards the years 1908-9 and 1907-8. In making up the statistics for 1906-7 adjustments of the entries in the Financial Statements were made by the Board wherever it appeared that the Elementary Education accounts included items which should more properly have been included, either in whole or in part, in the Higher Education accounts; more particularly as regards expenditure in respect of the maintenance of Public Elementary Schools, of administration, and of loan charges. The principal effect of the adjustments was to diminish the expenditure shown under these heads in the statistics relating to expenditure on Elementary Education, and to increase the corresponding entries relating to Higher Education. This difference in the treatment of the statistics for 1906-7 should be borne in mind when comparing the statistics for the three consecutive years ending with 1908-9 which are given in Tables 152, 154, and 160.

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TABLES 152 (E), 153 (E), 152 (W), and 153 (W).

In comparing the statistics given for Elementary and Higher Education respectively under any of the heads of Table 152, or in the columns of Table 153, it must be remembered that, for the years in respect of which statistics are given, there have been certain differences in the treatment of the statistics relating to Elementary Education as compared with the treatment of those relating to Higher Education. For detailed information as to the methods in accordance with which the two sets of statistics have been compiled, reference should be made to the notes on Tables 154-159, and on Tables 160-168 respectively, and these notes should be carefully studied before any attempt is made to draw inferences from the relative statistics given in Tables 152 and 153. It is also of particular importance in reference to both tables that the statements contained in the preceding paragraph should be duly taken into account.

TABLES 154-159 (E) and 154-159 (W)

These tables relate to the receipts and expenditure of Local Education Authorities in respect of Elementary Education. The general remarks on the tables relating to the Accounts of Local Authorities, contained in the two paragraphs on page xxvii, are applicable to these tables. It will be noted from the first sentence of the second of those paragraphs that certain discrepancies may exist between the figures given in Tables 154-159 and the corresponding figures published by the Local Government Board. These discrepancies may be increased owing to the fact that certain items have been omitted in these tables from both sides of the accounts. The following paragraphs indicate the principal omissions —

(1) School Fees are receipts of the Local Education Authority; but, in the case of a school not provided by the Authority, a certain portion of the fees is paid to the Managers, under Section 14 of the Education Act, 1902. This portion may be regarded as being merely passed through the accounts of the Authority, and it is therefore deducted from the total amount received. The fees included under *Head 5* of Table 154 (B), in *Column 20* of Table 156, and in *Column 5* of Table 158, represent the difference, which is the amount applicable to meet the expenses of the Authority.

(2) The Financial Statements show certain receipts under the head of Sinking Funds constituted for the discharge of loans, these receipts being partly (a) interest and dividends on the accumulated funds, and partly (b) amounts drawn from the funds for the purpose of paying off loans. The former (a) are either paid into the Sinking Fund, or are used, like the latter

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(b), for the purpose of paying off loans and the interest thereon. Since, however, the original payments into the Sinking Fund are included in the statistics, being regarded as substantive payments in respect of loan charges, these subsidiary receipts and payments must be treated, not as true receipts and payments, but as sums passed through the accounts, they would not appear if the loans were paid off by annual instalments, without the intervention of a Sinking Fund. The amounts entered in *Column 17* of Table 158, and in the corresponding portions of Tables 154 (*B*) and 156, as payments in respect of loan charges, are therefore the net amounts obtained by subtracting the receipts in respect of Sinking Funds from the gross payments (including payments to Sinking Funds) in respect of loan charges.

(3) Where *Certificated Teachers in Public Elementary Schools* contribute to the Deferred Annuity Fund (*see* page xviii) the contributions are made through the Local Education Authority, the amounts being deducted from the grants paid by the Board, and corresponding deductions are in most cases made by the Local Education Authority from the salaries of the teachers. These transactions are not shown in the tables, the grants and salaries entered being the gross amounts, not the net amounts actually received and paid.

(4) The only loans as to which particulars are included in the tables are loans to provide premises (including playgrounds), and furniture, for schools or offices, or, in a few cases, to provide compensation, or adjustment of property and liabilities, under the Education Act, 1902. Loans to current account, such as the loans raised to provide working balances, are excluded, as also are the repayments of these loans, the interest on them, and interest on bank overdrafts. Bank charges other than interest on overdraft (*e.g.*, commission, etc.) are, however, included in the statistics as part of the expenditure on administration. Interest received in respect of balance on current account is included to the extent to which it exceeds interest paid on bank overdraft.

(5) Balances, both those brought forward from the previous year, and those carried forward to the following year, are omitted.

(6) The endowments shown in the tables are the amounts actually received by the Local Education Authorities. In the case of County Councils these amounts are either credited to particular parishes, or actually paid to the overseers of the parishes. These latter payments are ignored in the tables, since the amounts so paid are in effect repaid in the form of rates, the net result being the same as if the parishes were merely credited with the amounts.

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(7) Certain receipts of a miscellaneous nature, which are in reality receipts to meet expenditure for purposes not primarily educational, or which for other reasons may properly be set off against expenditure, have, in so far as possible, been omitted from the receipts and deducted from the appropriate head of expenditure.

Under the head of receipts from rates and Borough funds, the tables show the amount raised in or for the year, diminished by the amount of any endowments paid over to overseers of particular parishes, these amounts being in effect included as receipts under the head of endowments [*see* (6) above]

It should be observed that in the case of a County Council the rate is not in general levied uniformly over the whole assessable area, since certain receipts or payments are credited or charged to particular parishes. The application of this remark to receipts from endowments is explained in (6) above. In other cases certain portions of the loan charges are charged on particular parishes or areas, under the Education Act, 1902, Section 18 (1), paragraphs (c) and (d). The statistics of loan charges given in these tables include the whole of such expenditure, whether raised on the whole area of the County Council or on particular parishes or areas. The amounts entered under the head of loan charges are, moreover, not diminished by the amount of any income tax paid, or payable, on the interest or dividends in respect of loans, but include the gross interest and dividends.

Receipts from the sale to children of books and other school requisites, and from the sale of articles made in school, have been grouped with receipts from fees. Thus under the term "other articles" there are included under *Head 5* of Table 154 (B), and in *Column 20* of Table 156, receipts from the sale of school requisites other than books to children in Public Elementary Schools, and from the sale of articles produced in those schools, such as needlework, food cooked by the scholars at lessons in cookery, etc. In *Column 5* of Table 158 the term "other articles" includes, in addition to the above, receipts from the sale of goods and work done in Industrial and Special Schools. Receipts from the sale to children of books and other school requisites are analogous to fees. Receipts from the sale of articles produced in the schools during the course of instruction are of a different character, but the returns do not enable the Board to separate them with certainty from the receipts in respect of the sale of books and other school requisites; they have accordingly been included with the latter receipts under the same heading as fees.

Certain of the receipts and payments shown in Table 158, and summarised in Tables 154 (B) and 156, are due to payments by one Local Education Authority to another. Where these

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payments take the form of contributions to meet loan charges they are included as part of the payments in respect of loan charges made by the contributing Authority, and the corresponding receipt in the accounts of the Authority to whom the contribution is made is deducted from the payments of that Authority in respect of loan charges. In other cases, however, the amount corresponding to a contribution by one Authority to another appears in the tables both as a payment made by the first Authority, and as a receipt to the accounts of the second Authority. Thus if Authority A contributed £500 (say) to Authority B in respect of expenditure incurred in connection with the maintenance of Special Schools, the amount (£500) would be included in *Column 14* of Table 158 so far as regards Authority A, and in *Column 4* of that table so far as regards Authority B. In the summary tables items of this character become cross-items, which should be removed if it is desired to ascertain the net total receipts and payments of all the Authorities taken together. The total amount of these cross-items is the total of the amounts shown in *Columns 7, 13, and 18* of Table 156 as receipts from Local Education Authorities.

In addition to the accounts of Local Education Authorities proper, the tables include the corresponding particulars as to the accounts of certain Industrial and Special Schools which are jointly maintained by two or more Local Education Authorities. These schools are managed by Joint Committees of the combining Authorities, described in the tables as "Joint Local Education Authorities." In dealing with the contributions of the individual Local Education Authorities the method of the preceding paragraph is adopted; the contribution being included in *Column 14* of Table 158 as a payment by the contributing Authority, and in *Column 4* as a receipt to the Joint Local Education Authority maintaining the school. loan charges, however, when appearing in the accounts of the Joint Authority, have been treated as substantive payments of that Authority, although actually met by contributions from the combining Authorities.

TABLES 158 (E) and 158 (W)

Column 5—In this column there are included contributions from parents in respect of Industrial and Special Schools, and receipts from the sale of goods and work done in those schools, in addition to the corresponding receipts in respect of Public Elementary Schools (*cf.* page xxx, as to the meaning of the term "other articles.")

Column 14—In this column there are included contributions to other Local Authorities in respect of Higher Elementary, Industrial, and Special Schools. The part of the expenditure

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of any one Authority which has been met by contributions from other Local Education Authorities is shown separately in the column, and indicated by footnotes

TABLES 160-168 (E) and 160-168 (W).

These tables relate to the receipts and expenditure of Local Authorities in respect of Higher Education, *i.e.*, education "other than elementary," under the Education Act, 1902, the Welsh Intermediate Education Act, 1889, the Public Libraries and Museums Acts, and Local or Private Acts. The general remarks on the tables relating to the accounts of Local Authorities, contained in the two paragraphs on page xxvii, are applicable to these tables.

By the term "Residue Grant" is to be understood the share of the residue of the local taxation (customs and excise) duties annually distributed, under Section 1 of the Local Taxation (Customs and Excise) Act, 1890, from the local taxation account to the Exchequer Contribution Accounts of Counties and County Boroughs, and then transferred to their Higher Education accounts under the provisions of Section 2 (1) of the Education Act, 1902, for the purpose of supplying or aiding the supply of education other than elementary, and of promoting the general co-ordination of all forms of education. The Residue Grant is paid to the Councils of Administrative Counties and County Boroughs only, and not also to the Councils of other Boroughs and Urban Districts.

In nearly all cases where a Borough or Urban District Council maintains schools or classes under the Board's Regulations for Technical Schools, Schools of Art, &c., the schools or classes are working under the direction of the County Council of the Administrative County in which the Borough or Urban District is situate. In all such cases the grants made by the Board are paid to the County Council. When the grant is handed over from the County funds to those of the Borough or Urban District, the receipt appearing in the accounts of the Borough or Urban District has in the statistics for 1908-9 been included under the head of receipts from other Local Authorities. The corresponding receipts for 1907-8 and 1906-7 were generally included under the head of grants from the Board, so that in the case of each of those years these grants are generally accounted for twice over in the summary tables.

In the statistics for 1906-7 grants paid under the Board's Regulations for Technical Schools, Schools of Art, &c., in respect of classes for teachers, and also grants paid under the same Regulations in respect of Art Pupil-Teachers, have in many cases been entered under the head of "Grants for the Training of Teachers other than Pupil-Teachers." In the statistics for

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1908-9 and 1907-8 these grants have, as far as possible, been tabulated under the head of "Grants for Technical, Art, and Evening and similar Schools and Classes." The amount of the grants in question is, however, relatively small.

The grants made by the Board of Education in aid of Local Science and Art Scholarships, and the payments by the Board in respect of the services of Special Local Secretaries, Assistants, and Superintendents, appointed to conduct the Board's Local Examinations in Science and Art, have been included under the head of "other receipts," and not as "Parliamentary Grants," in the statistics for 1908-9, and the same classification was adopted in most cases when compiling the statistics for 1907-8 and 1906-7.

In the case of the tables relating to Wales the figures given under the head of receipts from rates and Borough funds include the produce of rates raised under the Welsh Intermediate Education Act, 1889. The grants received by certain Local Education Authorities in Wales under the Agricultural Rates Act, 1896, and the subsequent Acts continuing those grants, have in the present volume been treated as Parliamentary Grants, as in the statistics relating to the Elementary Education accounts.

As in the case of the statistics of the receipts of Local Education Authorities in respect of Elementary Education, the figures relating to receipts from fees include receipts from the sale of books and other articles (*cf.* page xxx). Under the term "other articles" there are included, besides receipts from the sale of school requisites other than books, receipts from the sale of articles produced at or in connection with the classes; for instance, from the sale of butter at a class for dairy work, or of cooked food at a class for cookery.

Amounts received from Local Authorities in respect of rent have, as a rule, been included under the head of "other receipts" in the statistics, but in some cases, where the precise nature of the item was doubtful, receipts which are probably of the nature of rent have been allowed to stand under the head of "receipts from Local Authorities."

Balances have been omitted from the statistics; except that in the few cases where a balance has been taken over by a Local Authority, from a superseded voluntary committee, it has been included in the figures as a receipt.

The phrase "not maintained by any Council," as applied to schools, classes, and centres, should be taken to mean schools, &c., maintained by bodies or persons other than Local Authorities. It should be noted that in some areas all, or almost all, the grants made by the Board in respect of these schools, &c., are paid through the Local Authority, whilst in other areas considerable sums are paid direct to the managers or governing

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bodies. This difference of system does not necessarily correspond with differences in the amount of additional aid given by the Local Authorities to the schools, &c, but the apparent expenditure of a Local Authority will be greater in the former case than in the latter, in which a considerable part of the expenditure incurred in the area does not pass through the Local Authority's accounts

In the statistics for 1908-9 and 1907-8 payments in respect of loans for education offices have been included under the head of "administration," wherever such payments have been indicated in the returns, in accordance with the practice adopted for the statistics of expenditure on Elementary Education. In the statistics for 1906-7 such payments are usually included under one or other of the sub-heads provided for loan charges in respect of Secondary Schools, &c, in respect of Technical and Art Schools, &c., or in respect of the Training of Teachers other than Pupil-Teachers

Transactions relating to Sinking Funds constituted for the discharge of loans have been treated in these tables, for the year 1908-9, in the same way as in the Elementary Education accounts, as explained in paragraph (2) on pages xxviii and xxix. But for the years 1907-8 and 1906-7 a different method was adopted, the receipts shown in the Financial Statements under the head of Sinking Funds being for those years included under the head of "other receipts," and the payments to Sinking Funds under "loan charges." Consequently the figures shown for 1907-8 and 1906-7 under the latter head, in the statistics relating to the Higher Education accounts, exceed the true net expenditure in respect of loan charges by the receipts from Sinking Funds, which were merely passed through the accounts

The gross amount of bank interest received, together with bank charges (*e.g.*, commission, &c) and interest on overdraft, have all been included in the statistics relating to the Higher Education accounts; the bank charges and interest on overdraft being entered either under the head of "administration" or under "other payments," according to the classification adopted by the Local Authority

As in the case of the statistics relating to the Elementary Education accounts, certain of the receipts and payments shown in Table 164, and summarised in Tables 160 (*B*) and 162, are due to payments by one Local Authority to another. The amounts corresponding to these contributions should appear in the tables both as payments made by the contributing Authority, and as receipts to the accounts of the Authority to whom the contribution is made. In the summary tables items of this character become cross-items, which should be removed if it is desired to ascertain the net total receipts and payments of all the Authorities taken together. The total amount of these cross-items is the amount shown under *Head 4*

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of Table 160 (B) as receipts from Local Authorities. There are, however, certain discrepancies between the payments and the receipts under this head. In this connection reference may be made to the paragraph on page xxxiii relating to receipts from Local Authorities in respect of rent; and, for the years 1907-8 and 1906-7, to the last paragraph but one on page xxxii. It should be added that contributions by one Local Authority to another in respect of loan charges have not been deducted, as in the case of the statistics relating to the Elementary Education accounts, from the payments in respect of loan charges made by the Authority to whom the contribution is made, but have been treated in the same way as other payments by one Authority to another.

The statistics relating to the Higher Education accounts of Local Authorities do not include the accounts of Joint Education Committees established under Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902, or of Joint Bodies otherwise established by two or more Local Authorities. The contributions by Local Authorities to such Joint Committees or Bodies are, however, included in the statistics, as a rule under the head of payments in respect of the maintenance of schools or classes, etc., "not maintained by any Council."

As regards Tables 161-168, it should be observed that part of the expenditure of the Council of an Administrative County may have been incurred in respect of schools or classes established and maintained by that Council within the areas of Boroughs or Urban Districts situate within the County, and that any such Borough or Urban District may, or may not, also incur expenditure of its own on Higher Education. It should, therefore, be borne in mind that a relatively small expenditure on the part of a Borough or Urban District does not necessarily indicate that the needs of Higher Education do not receive sufficient attention within its area, since the County Council may have undertaken the responsibility of supplying or aiding the supply of education other than elementary therein. It may be noted in this connection that those Borough and Urban District Councils which are Local Education Authorities for Elementary Education are, as a rule, more active in exercising the concurrent powers in respect of education other than elementary which are vested in them by Section 3 of the Education Act, 1902, than Borough and Urban District Councils which are not Local Education Authorities for Elementary Education. In the tables a distinction has been made between these two types of Authority, the names of the areas of the former (including Authorities who have relinquished part or the whole of their powers) being printed in small capitals, and those of the latter in ordinary type.

* The statistics relating to the County Borough of Hanley do, however, include the accounts of the Joint Committee of the Staffordshire Potteries Pupil-Teacher Centre.

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TABLES 162 (E) and 162 (W).

For information as to the principles in accordance with which the figures of "School Population," given in *Columns 14 and 28* of these tables, have been compiled, reference should be made to the notes on Tables 165 and 166 respectively; and as regards *Column 42*, which gives statistics of unclassified payments to Local Authorities, reference may be made to the second paragraph of the note on Table 164

TABLES 164 (E) and 164 (W)

The figures which are given in *Column 2*, as representing the estimated net produce of a penny rate, have been calculated for the Administrative Counties (including London), for Non-County Boroughs, and for Urban Districts, on the basis of the Assessable Value for the purpose of Poor Rates, and for other rates which are levied in the same manner as Poor Rates, the Assessable Value being less than the full Rateable Value by half the rateable value of agricultural land. In the case of London the Assessable Value has been taken as that in force on 6th April, 1908, for other Administrative Counties, Non-County Boroughs, and Urban Districts, as that in force on 25th March, 1908. For all these areas a uniform deduction of 5 per cent has been made from the full produce of a penny rate, as calculated on the Assessable Value, in order to allow for loss in collection. In the remaining case of the County Boroughs the figures for the net produce of a penny rate have been taken from *Column 4* of Table 151 in Part II. for 1907-8-9, which gives particulars with reference to the Aid Grant for 1908-9. The method of calculation of the figures for the County Boroughs is the same as that explained on pages xxiv and xxv in reference to the Aid Grant figures for 1909-10; but the figures for 1908-9 are based on the Assessable Value in force on 1st April, 1908. Thus, in the case of the County Boroughs, the percentage of deduction from the full produce of a penny rate varies in accordance with the actual losses incurred in the different areas, subject, however, to a maximum of 10 per cent.; and the Assessable Value sometimes differs from the full Rateable Value by more than half the rateable value of agricultural land. It should be noted that the figures given for Administrative Counties in *Column 2* are based on the Assessable Value of the whole area of the Administrative County, including the Boroughs and Urban Districts situate within it, so that the total for the whole country is obtained by adding the figures for the Counties and County Boroughs only, and neglecting those for the Boroughs and Urban Districts.

The greater part of the unclassified payments to Local Authorities, which have been entered in *Column 18* of Table 164,

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is no doubt ultimately applied to one or other of the purposes specified in *Columns 15-17*, but the Board do not possess sufficient information for a more precise allocation of the payments in question.

TABLES 165-168 (E) and 165-168 (W).

These tables afford a detailed analysis of the whole of the expenditure included in Table 164, with the exception of payments to other Local Authorities, expenditure in respect of administration, and items included under the head of "other payments" in *Column 22*, e.g., capital expenditure Table 165 relates to payments in respect of Secondary Schools, Preparatory Classes, and Pupil-Teacher Centres Table 166 relates to payments in respect of Technical Institutions, Day Technical Classes, Schools of Art, Art Classes, and Evening and similar Schools and Classes, and it also includes certain grants made by Local Authorities to Universities, expenditure in respect of agricultural education, &c Table 168 relates to payments in respect of the Training of Teachers other than Pupil-Teachers With regard to Table 167 reference should be made to the note on that table below

TABLES 165 (E) and 165 (W)

The statistics of "School Population," appearing in *Column 2*, are given only for the areas of those Local Authorities which are Local Education Authorities within the meaning of Part I of the Education Act, 1902, i.e., for Administrative Counties and County Boroughs, the Councils of which have full powers under Part II of the Act in respect of Higher Education Corresponding figures are not given for Boroughs and Urban Districts, but the figures given for the Administrative Counties cover the whole of the area of the County, including the Boroughs and Urban Districts situate within it. The figures given for any individual Local Education Authority include the aggregate number of pupils in all the Secondary Schools and Preparatory Classes, in the area of that Authority, which were recognised by the Board as efficient during the year, whether the schools or classes were maintained by the Authority or not The pupils attending a school or class situate outside the area of the Local Education Authority by whom it was maintained have been included in the school population of the latter Authority, and not in that of the Local Education Authority in whose area the school or class was situate. The figures included in respect of Secondary Schools include the pupils in those Secondary Schools which were recognised by the Board as efficient, but were not on the Grant List, at the date to which the figures relate. The statistics of "School

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Population" given for any individual Local Education Authority also include all the Pupil-Teachers employed by that Authority, whether instructed in Secondary Schools or Pupil-Teacher Centres, or not, and, in the former case, whether the School or Centre is situate within the area of the Authority or outside it. Pupil-Teachers employed by the Councils of Boroughs and Urban Districts are included in the figures relating to the Administrative County in which the Borough or Urban District is situate. Since Pupil-Teachers are only in half-time attendance, roughly speaking, at Secondary Schools or Pupil-Teacher Centres, they have each been reckoned as equivalent to half a unit only for the purpose of the figures given in *Column 2*

The number of pupils in Secondary Schools included in the figures of "School Population" is the number in the Schools on 1st October, 1908; except that the figures relate to 1st February, 1909, in the case of a few Schools on the Grant List which were recognised only for the last seven months of the year 1st August, 1908, to 31st July, 1909. The figures included on account of Pupils in Preparatory Classes and Pupil-Teachers relate to the number recognised at the beginning of the school year which ended on 31st July, 1909, except that in the case of a few Pupil-Teachers recognised from 1st January, the figures relate to the beginning of the calendar year 1909.

In comparing the figures of school population with the statistics of expenditure given in this table, it should be borne in mind that whilst the former relate only to schools recognised by the Board as efficient, it is probable that in some cases the expenditure shown in the table as having been made in respect of Secondary Schools was incurred in connection with schools which were not on the List of Secondary Schools recognised by the Board as efficient.

TABLES 166 (R) and 166 (W).

The statistics of "School Population," appearing in *Column 2*, are given for Administrative Counties and County Boroughs only, as in the case of the corresponding figures given in *Column 2* of Table 165. The figures given for any individual Local Education Authority represent the aggregate number of students who attended at any time, during the year which ended on 31st July, 1909, at any type of school or class, in the area of the Authority, which was recognised by the Board as eligible for grant for that year under the provisions of the Regulations for Technical Schools, Schools of Art, &c., whether the school or class was maintained by the Local Education Authority or not. Thus the figures relate to the number of students in attendance at Technical Institutions, Day Technical Classes, Schools of Art, Art Classes, and Evening and similar Schools.

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and Classes. The students attending a school or class situate outside the area of the Local Education Authority under whose direction it was working have been included in the school population of the latter Authority, and not in that of the Local Education Authority in whose area the school or class was situate.

It may be observed that in the case of a few Local Authorities no expenditure appears in *Column 5*, in respect of the salaries of teachers, although figures appear under one or more of the other three subdivisions (*Columns 3, 4, and 6*) provided for payments in respect of schools and classes maintained by the Authority. This is due in some cases to local arrangements between the Council of a Borough or Urban District and the Council of the Administrative County in which the Borough or Urban District is situate, according to which the cost of maintaining the schools or classes is divided between the two Authorities.

TABLES 167 (E) and 167 (W).

These tables give particulars of the part of the expenditure shown in Table 166, excluding loan charges, which has been returned by the Local Authorities as having been made in respect of Schools and Classes for Day Teaching. For this purpose the Authorities have been requested to regard as coming under the head of Day Teaching those schools and classes whose distinguishing feature is that they give specialised and organised courses of instruction to students who are able to devote a considerable or perhaps the greater part of their time to such instruction, which aims at qualifying them specially for particular professions or occupations, or types of professions or occupations. The bulk of the work done in the greater number of such schools and classes is no doubt conducted in the day-time, but it was pointed out in the instructions referred to that it would be proper to include under the category in question any schools or classes which have the distinguishing features above explained, whether their work is done in the day time or in the evening, or in both. The remainder of the expenditure included in Table 166 should, in so far as the allocation has been correctly made by the Local Authorities, relate to schools and classes attended exclusively or mainly by students already engaged in some occupation taking up the greater part of their time, and this feature is sufficient to secure that the bulk of the work is done in the evening. This is not, however, an essential part of the distinction, and classes held at any hour of the day may be marked by the same distinguishing characteristics.

*Explanatory Notes.***4.—Salaries of Teachers in Public Elementary Schools**
—Tables 169–178 (E) and 169–178 (W).

These tables give statistics of the salaries of certain classes of teachers on the staff of Public Elementary Schools on the last days of the respective school years. The figures are given separately for Ordinary Public Elementary Schools and for Higher Elementary Schools, but teachers on the staff of the other kinds of Elementary Schools for which statistics are included in Part I (viz., Certified Schools for Blind, Deaf, Mentally Defective, Physically Defective, or Epileptic Children; "Certified Efficient" Schools; and Poor Law Schools) are not counted for these tables.

The terms employed in the tables are used in the same sense as throughout Tables 1–36 of Part I, and for explanation of their meaning reference should be made to the notes on pages xxiv–xxix of Part I (Educational Statistics, 1908–9). Thus, as regards the term "Certificated Teacher," reference should be made to the third paragraph on page xxviii of Part I; the term "Uncertificated" is used in the sense explained in the second footnote to Table 171. The principles governing the inclusion or exclusion of individual teachers in any class are the same as those which governed their inclusion or exclusion for the purpose of the statistics relating to the number of teachers on the staff; exceptional cases are dealt with in the last paragraph on page xxix of Part I.

In addition to the salaries, particulars of which are given in these tables, teachers in some cases have a house or rooms provided free of charge. In the case of schools attached to Boarding Institutions, and not maintained by Local Education Authorities (Education Act, 1902, Section 15), the teachers are frequently provided with board as well as lodging, and in these cases the salary taken for the purpose of the tables includes the estimated value of the board and lodging when stated on the returns.

For the purpose of these tables the salaries have been taken to the nearest pound, and tabulated accordingly. Thus the entry "under £100" should strictly be read as "under £99 10s.", the entry "£100 and under £200" as "£99 10s. and under £199 10s.", and so on.

TABLES 169 (E) and 169 (W)

In addition to the teachers to whom these tables relate, there were others whose salaries were not stated, or were included with those of other teachers; as shown for 1908–9 in Tables 170–174, and for previous years in corresponding tables of earlier issues.

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5.—*Grants for Secondary Schools, Pupils in Preparatory Classes, Pupil-Teachers, and Bursars—
Tables 179–185 (E) and 179–185 (W).*

Table 179 relates to the grants paid under the Regulations for Secondary Schools, with the exception of the grants paid in aid of Local Science and Art Scholarships, which are shown under *Head 3 (d)* of Table 139. The grants paid by the Treasury in aid of Welsh Intermediate Schools regulated by Schemes made under the Welsh Intermediate Education Act, 1889, are not included in the grants shown in Table 179 for Wales. Tables 180–185 relate to the grants paid under the Regulations for the Preliminary Education of Elementary School Teachers, which include the grants paid to Pupil-Teacher Centres forming parts of, or attached to, Secondary Schools.

The figures for the amount of grant give the grant paid in respect of the year, or other period, to which they relate, and not the amount actually paid within the year. They relate for the most part (so far as 1908–9 is concerned, almost entirely) to the twelve months from 1st August to 31st July.

TABLES 179 (L) and 179 (W)

The classification of Schools adopted in Table 179 (B) corresponds with the normal classification adopted in Part I.

An "Ex-P.E.S." pupil means a pupil who attended a Public Elementary School for at least the two years immediately preceding his admission to the Secondary School.

TABLES 180 (L) and 180 (W).

The normal grant on account of Registered Pupils in Preparatory Classes was £4 per annum for each Pupil.

The normal grant on account of Pupil-Teachers was at the rate of £7 for each Pupil-Teacher on account of whom grant is included under *Heads 2 (a) (i)* or *2 (a) (ii) (β)*, and £7 10s for each Pupil-Teacher on account of whom grant is included under *Head 2 (a) (ii) (α)*, an extra grant [*Head 2 (c)*] being paid to County Councils (other than the County Council for London) in aid of the travelling and incidental expenses of Pupil-Teachers, at the rate of £2 for each Pupil-Teacher on account of whom grant is included under *Head 2 (a)*, and who was employed in a Public Elementary School maintained by the Council. For Pupil-Teachers on account of whom grant is included under *Head 2 (b)* the rate of grant approximated to an average of £4 in each year, the actual normal rate varying in different areas between the limits of £2 and £5 for 1908–9 and 1907–8, and between the limits of £3 and £5 for 1906–7.

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The normal grants for Pupil-Teachers instructed in Centres, and for Registered Pupils in Preparatory Classes, were paid to the authorities of the Centres and Classes.

Grants on account of Bursars were paid in all cases to the Local Authority by whom the Bursar was recommended for recognition. The grant in aid of the initial expenses incidental to the introduction of the Bursary system [*Head 3 (a)*] was paid at the rate of £10 for each Bursar. It was only paid in respect of the year 1908-9 to Authorities who had not profited, or had not fully profited, by it in 1907-8.

A Bursar instructed at a Secondary School on the Grant List is eligible, in common with other pupils in the School, to be reckoned for grant under the Regulations for Secondary Schools; but in addition, under the Regulations for the Preliminary Education of Elementary School Teachers, the Board pay a special grant in aid of the education of Bursars at Secondary Schools, whether on the Grant List or not, which are recognised by the Board as efficient, this grant being described in *Head 3 (b)* as the Principal Grant. The Principal Grant is paid at the rate of £10 for each Bursar who has received continuous and suitable instruction throughout the year of his Bursarship, subject to the satisfaction of certain conditions as regards examination and subsequent training. Where the Local Authority makes a maintenance allowance of not less than £5 to a Bursar, the Board contribute half the amount of the allowance, or £5, whichever may be the less, this grant being described as the Maintenance Grant.

The grant on account of the travelling and incidental expenses of Bursars, shown under *Head 3 (c)*, was at the rate of £2 for each Bursar ordinarily resident in the area for Elementary Education of a County Council (other than London), who had received continuous and suitable instruction throughout the year of his Bursarship. The grant was paid to the Local Authority by whom the Bursar was recommended for recognition.

TABLES 181 (E) and 181 (W)

A Pupil-Teacher Centre is regarded as forming an integral part of a Secondary School if it is under the same Governing Body, and the same Head Master or Head Mistress, as the School, and if the Pupil-Teachers instructed in it share the ordinary corporate life of the School.

The payment of grants on account of Bursars depends on conditions which as a rule are not fulfilled until at least a year after the completion of Bursarship. The number of Bursars on account of whom grants were paid [*Head 5 (a)*] in respect of the year 1907-8, is therefore very small in comparison with the number of Bursars recognised for that year, the first

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of the Bursar system. The much larger number shown in the column for 1908-9 consists partly of those of the Bursars recognised for 1908-9 who fulfilled the conditions of grant immediately after the conclusion of Bursarship, but mainly of those Bursars recognised for 1907-8 who did not fulfil all the conditions of grant until the summer of 1909. As soon as the Bursar system has been long enough in operation for conditions to become normal, the number of Bursars on account of whom grant is paid in respect of any one year may be expected to correspond roughly with the number actually recognised for the previous year.

Pupil-Teachers and Bursars are not included in these tables until the question of their eligibility for grant has been finally decided.

TABLES 182 (E), 183 (E), 182 (W), and 183 (W)

The statistics in these tables relate to the areas of the Local Education Authorities for Elementary Education responsible for the maintenance of the Elementary Schools in which the Pupil-Teachers were employed

The third paragraph of the note on Table 181 applies to these tables also

TABLES 184 (F), 185 (E), 184 (W), and 185 (W)

The second and third paragraphs of the note on Table 181 should be read in connection with these tables

6 — *Accounts of Training Colleges and Hostels for Elementary School Teachers—Tables 186-191 (L) and 186-191 (W)*

The year to which the accounts of Training Colleges and Hostels for Elementary School Teachers relate consists, in general, of the twelve months from 1st August to 31st July, but in some cases it ends on 30th June, 31st August, or 30th September.

Grants are paid annually by the Board to Training Colleges on account of Recognised Students. The Grants are at different rates for men and for women, and are also at different rates for Resident Students or Hostel Students (i.e., Day Students resident in a Hostel) and for Day Students not resident in a Hostel. In the case of a Resident Student, the Grant is in respect not only of his instruction, but also of his board and lodging. In the case of a Day Student, the Grant to the Training College is in respect of his instruction, and a further Grant is paid to meet the cost of board and lodging. If the Student is resident in a recognised Hostel, this further Grant is paid to the Hostel, and is at such a rate that the College

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Grant and the Hostel Grant taken together amount to the Grant payable to a Residential College on account of a Resident Student. If the Day Student is not resident in a recognised Hostel, the further Grant is at a lower rate, and is paid as a Personal Grant to the student through the College authorities

The Grant is paid partly by instalments during the session, and partly by a balance after the close of the session, so that the receipts for each year ordinarily include the balance of Grant in respect of one (*i.e.*, the preceding) session, and the instalments of Grant in respect of another (*i.e.*, the current) session. The receipts cannot therefore be taken as presenting a statement of income in respect of the session

Allowance must, moreover, be made for certain changes which began to be introduced, during the period covered by the tables, as regards the system of paying instalments. For years preceding 1906-7, the whole of the Grants to Colleges on account of Day Students, and of the Personal Grant to Day Students not resident in Hostels, used to be paid during the session; but in the case of Resident Students in Residential Colleges, and of Day Students resident in Hostels, a comparatively large part of the Grant was held over until after the end of the session, for the purpose of adjustment. In 1906-7 small parts of the Grants to Colleges on account of Day Students, and of the Personal Grant to Day Students not resident in Hostels, were similarly held over till after the end of the session, and in the Regulations for 1907-8 the part of the Grant held over in the case of the other Students was reduced, so as to form only a relatively small portion of the whole. Under the Regulations in force for 1907-8 onwards, the main part of the Grant is accordingly in each case paid in the course of the session, a small balance only being left over for the purpose of any adjustment which may be found necessary after the returns for a complete session have been made. Since the dates at which payments have been made by the Training Colleges and Hostels have probably been influenced by the dates of payment of Grant, the payments in the successive years 1906-7, 1907-8, and 1908-9, cannot in strictness be taken as exactly comparable with one another.

In comparing the Grant to a Residential College with the number of students, account must also be taken of the "credit limitation" to which the amount of Grant has been subject. A brief explanation of the system will be found in Appendix C to the Introduction to the Volume of Statistics for 1905-6-7 (pages xlvii and xlviii). The system has ceased to operate as regards Grants for periods after 31st July, 1908; but the accounts of any Colleges to which it may have applied would be affected by it until the year 1908-9 inclusive.

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In addition to the Grants mentioned above, Grants under the same set of Regulations of the Board are paid to Local Education Authorities in aid of the provision of Training Colleges and Hostels. The main part of any such Building Grant would in the ordinary course be paid before the College or Hostel was opened, and would therefore not appear in any Current Account of the College or Hostel. These Building Grants are accordingly not shown in the tables, and any capital expenditure in respect of which the Grants have been paid or are payable has similarly been excluded; the particulars are, however, given in footnotes to the tables.

Grants are also paid under the same Regulations in aid of the rent of temporary premises, where permanent premises cannot at once be provided, or when the number requiring permanent accommodation is, for the time being, uncertain. These Grants and the corresponding rent have been included in the main body of the tables, particulars as to the amounts of the Grants to individual Colleges and Hostels being shown separately in footnotes to Tables 190 and 191.

The tables are abstracted from the accounts furnished annually by the Training Colleges and Hostels, and show the receipts and payments of the year to which they relate. The accounts of a College have reference to the students attending it, whether resident in the College or not, and accordingly the numbers of these students are given for purposes of comparison. The accounts of a Hostel have reference to the students residing in it, and the numbers of these students are also given in the tables, but in this case the figures include some students who are neither Recognised Students nor Private Students within the meaning of the Regulations (see the first paragraph of the note on Table 186 below).

In abstracting the contents of the tables from the accounts of individual Colleges and Hostels, it has been necessary to have regard to the fact that certain of the receipts cannot be regarded as constituting income of the College or Hostel, but are rather sums to be set off against payments. For instance, the payments made by Colleges in respect of board of students have been reduced by sums paid to the College by Day Students for meals supplied. Similarly receipts in respect of breakages have been deducted from payments in respect of replacement of furniture, and receipts in respect of garden produce, &c., have been deducted from payments in respect of College or Hostel grounds. The amounts shown as received from fees are the net amounts, after allowing for any refund of fees overpaid by students.

The net income from endowment, as shown in the tables, does not represent the total income arising out of the endowment of Training Colleges and Hostels, since the income is in

Explanatory Notes.

some cases, under Orders of the Charity Commissioners and the Board of Education, applied to such purposes as replacement of capital, without passing through the accounts of the Colleges or Hostels.

The payments described as "reduction of mortgage," under the head of "other payments (not in respect of maintenance)," may be taken as representing expenditure on capital provision in some other year than that to which the accounts relate. Where such expenditure has been met by a loan raised on mortgage of the College or premises, the rule is that the payments are treated for statistical purposes as not being made until the loan is paid off. In the first instance, therefore, the actual capital expenditure in any year is reduced by the amount of the loan raised to meet it, and the subsequent repayments of loan are treated as substantive payments, and described as payments in reduction of mortgage.

In some cases a loan of this kind is discharged by means of a Sinking Fund, which remains under the control of the College or Hostel. In such a case the accounts of the Sinking Fund are regarded as part of the complete accounts, and the annual transfers from the Current Account to the Sinking Fund do not therefore appear in the abstract of the accounts as a whole. When payments in reduction of mortgage are made out of the Sinking Fund, they appear as substantive payments.

Transfers to such funds as Depreciation Fund, Repairs Fund, Pensions Fund, Library Fund, &c., are dealt with in the same way as transfers to Sinking Funds; i.e., the accounts of these funds are incorporated with the ordinary Current Account of the College or Hostel, so that the transfers from the latter to the various funds do not appear in the total result. The payments in respect of pensions, for instance, which are shown in Table 189, are not transfers to a Pensions Fund, but are the actual amounts paid to the pensioners, whether out of Current Account or out of a separate Pensions Fund.

The accounts of the Upper Norwood Residential Training College for the Blind are not included in the summary tables 186-188, but particulars as to the receipts and estimated payments of the College (which forms part of a larger institution) are given at the end of Table 189 for England.

TABLES 186 (E) and 186 (W).

The figures as to the number of students, given under *Head 2*, include a certain number of students who are neither Recognised Students, nor Private Students, within the meaning of the Regulations. In some cases such students may be counted both under *Head 2 (c)* and under *Head 2 (d)*. It is not therefore possible to give a correct total under *Head 2*.

Explanatory Notes.

In comparing the receipts of Training Colleges and Hostels, as shown under *Head 3*, with the payments, as shown under *Head 4*, it is necessary to make allowance for the fact that the receipts under *Head 3 (a)* include the Personal Grants, as shown under *Head 3 (f)*, and that there is no corresponding entry under *Head 4*.

TABLES 188 (E) and 188 (W)

Under *Head 2* of Table 188 (A) is shown the total amount of grants and fees received on account of Recognised Students, for comparison with the total amount of fees received on account of other students (including Private Students). As a rule, however, these two amounts will not bear the same proportion to one another as the numbers of Recognised Students and other students respectively, since the sum received by a Residential College by way of grants and fees, or by way of fees only, as the case may be, is less in the case of a Day Student than in the case of a student resident in the College, and the proportion that the numbers of students in these two classes bear to one another is not the same in the case of Recognised Students as in the case of the other students. Similarly, the total amount received by a College and Hostel together on account of a Hostel Student is greater than the amount received by a College in the case of a Day Student not resident in a Hostel, whilst the ratio of the numbers of students in these two classes is again different for the Recognised Students and other students respectively.

TABLES 189-191 (E) and 189-191 (W)

The figures given for the number of Day Students at Residential Colleges in *Column 12* of Table 189, and for the number of Students at Day Training Colleges in *Columns 11* and *12* of Table 190, include Recognised Students resident in Hostels, as shown in *Column 10* of Table 191. They may also include some other students who are included in *Column 11* of Table 191, but are neither Recognised Students, nor Private Students, within the meaning of the Regulations (*see* the first paragraph of the note on Table 186 above).

TABLES 190 (E) and 190 (W).

In the case of a Day Training College whose accounts form part of those of a University or University College, the greater part of the amount shown in *Column 14* may be taken as representing a contribution, out of the funds of the Day Training College, to meet expenditure which is incurred partly on account of recognised Training College students, and partly on account of other students of the University or University College. There is, however, no uniform system of apportionment of this expenditure.
