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## EDITOR'S PREFACE

THIS is the fifth of a series of bibliographies and reading lists which have been produced with the help of money provided by Nuffield College. Their original purpose was to provide working lists for the use of members of the Colonial Services, but when a student of the status of Dr. Meek agreed to undertake this list it naturally and most advantageously developed into a bibliography. Even so, the detailed arrangement of the titles should allow the practical and hard-worked colonial administrator to find the material that may serve his needs.

The great importance of the subject covered in this bibliography will be clear to all who have any knowledge of colonial affairs. The relationship between Britain and the colonial peoples in the field of law has produced very deep effects, but it has also given rise to problems and ambiguities which urgently need study. It is strange that a people so proud of their achievement in the sphere of law as the British should have given so little serious attention to the wider significance of this side of their imperial responsibilities. Dr. Meek can, unfortunately, list few books that deal directly with the problem, though there are many which provide the anthropological data upon indigenous systems. It may be hoped that his bibliography will serve as an invitation to comparative and analytic study of the subject.

## PREFACE

THIS bibliography has been prepared for the use of members of the Colonial Service and of any others who may be interested in the law of the British colonial territories and its administration. It is particularly concerned with the indigenous systems of law and custom in Africa, and since these are developing rapidly under new social and economic conditions a good deal of material has been included on legal theory and history, sociological jurisprudence, and the development of the legal systems of India and Ceylon under British rule. Extensive use has also been made of South African data, a full bibliography of which was published under the editorship of Professor Schapera by the Oxford University Press in 1941,<sup>1</sup> and a shorter bibliography in *Bantu Studies* by Mr. Julius Lewin.<sup>2</sup>

Originally it was intended that the bibliography should be a brief one; but as some students are likely to be more interested than others in particular branches of the subject, or in particular territories, it seemed advisable to present a fairly comprehensive list, indicating the more important works by an asterisk, and the most important by a double asterisk.

I must express my gratitude to Dr. S. Vesey-Fitzgerald, Professor Raymond Firth, Dr. Audrey Richards, Dr. J. S. Furnivall, and Dr. Felhoen Kraal for a number of valuable suggestions; also to Mr. J. A. Hutton for undertaking the tedious task of seeing the bibliography through the press.

It will be observed that the arrangement of the headings has not followed a uniform principle, being sometimes functional and sometimes territorial. This arrangement, if illogical, seemed to be the most convenient.

(h) Legal Practitioners, (i) Native Courts, (j) Native Law, (k) Muhammadan Law, and (l) Prisons.

C. *The Dominions and Colonial Office List* contains much information on the history, political and administrative structure, and legal systems of the various dependencies.

D. The *Annual Reports* on the Social and Economic Progress of the Peoples of the various territories include a chapter describing the judicial organization of the colony. These reports also include a chapter describing the more important ordinances enacted during the year. In addition, separate reports are issued annually by the Judicial and Legal Departments of the local governments, and by the Police and Prison Departments.

E. The *Statutes* of the various colonies are available in printed volumes, which are periodically revised so as to embody all later amendments and additions.<sup>1</sup> Subordinate legislation is sometimes compiled annually and issued in supplementary volumes. Where this is not done the Statutory Rules and Orders made under the various ordinances will be found in the local government gazettes. The increasing output of subordinate or administrative legislation has in most colonial territories caused large arrears in the work of consolidation. On the other hand, large sections of the law have been codified, and in most colonial territories there are Codes of Criminal Law and Procedure, Evidence, and Civil Procedure. Native law and custom have seldom been reduced to the form of written statutes.

F. *Law Reports*. Most of the colonies publish reports of the more important cases tried each year in the Superior Courts of their territory.<sup>2</sup> The decisions of the East and West African Courts of Appeal are also recorded in printed volumes. The decisions of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council are published annually and provide the most authoritative source for the study of colonial law. For digests of Native Appeal Court Cases in the Transkeian Territories of South Africa, the Cape and Orange Free State Divisions, Natal, Transvaal, and Southern Rhodesia, the reader should consult the *Short Survey of Native Law in South Africa*, by Julius Lewin, pp. 80-2 (reprinted from *Bantu Studies*, June 1941).
